

#### The Playschool

Ardcarne Community Childcare Services CLG is situated in our school. The playschool is run by a Management Committee which is independent of the National School. Twenty-two children attend and there are 5 fully qualified childcare practitioners in the service. There is an "Breakfast Club" Session from 8:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m., a "Early Bird" Session from 9:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. and the "Aistear" Session from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., a "Late Pick Up" Session from 12:30 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. There is also an Afterschool scheme. This is for Junior and Senior Infants class from 2.10 p.m.
